This year's 123rd Continental Congress did not disappoint attendees. It was full of wonderful programs, interesting speakers, luncheons, music, and fanfare. The highlight for this state officer was the Sunday installation ceremony. It was an honor and privilege to be installed as your 62nd Iowa State Regent. Thank you for the opportunity to serve in this position.

Honorary State Regent Barbara Halpin was elected to serve as Vice President General for a three-year term 2014-2017 and was installed into her office on Sunday of Continental Congress. We are very proud of you Barbara, congratulations! Honorary State Regent Susan Harris completed her three-year term as a Vice President General 2011-2014. Susan has been a wonderful representative for the state of Iowa. Judy McNamara, Jean Marie Cardinell Chapter, was the 2014 DAR Service to Veterans Award North Central Division Winner. Carson Joy Miller, sponsored by the James Harlan Chapter, was the National 3rd Place — 7th Grade Level winner in the 2014 American History Essay Contest. The Iowa Society and members received 23 certificates of recognition during Congress. On National Defense evening, President General Lynn Forney Young recognized Honorary Vice President General and Honorary Iowa State Regent Yvonne Boone and her family with a Certificate of Honor from the Department of Defense Vietnam War Commemoration. Mrs. Boone lost her son during Vietnam. The President General said it was a privilege to present her with this certificate in recognition of the patriotism, service and sacrifice of her son and family. Our Iowa Society can be proud of our accomplishments, honors, and recognitions received at this year's Continental Congress.

The new state theme is: "Promoting Education to Encourage Lifelong Learning". Henry Ford once said, "Anyone who stops learning is old, whether at twenty or eighty. Anyone who keeps learning stays young. The greatest thing in life is to keep your mind young." Our Iowa Society will work towards accomplishing the following objectives in the upcoming two years:

- The Iowa Society has set a goal of raising \$10,000.00 in donations to be given to the Kate Duncan Smith DAR School (KDS) located in Grant, AL towards education in their classrooms. The Iowa Society has promoted Historical Preservation and Patriotism during the last several administrations. This project supports the National Society's second objective in their Mission Statement, "The mission of the National Society Daughters of the American Revolution is to promote historic preservation, education, and patriotism."
- The Iowa Chapters will continue to support education in their local communities.
- The Iowa Society and the Iowa Society Chapters will become partners with The United States of America Vietnam War 50th Anniversary Commemoration.
- The Iowa Society will continue to increase and retain our membership. Our chapters will use the Action Five Committee to assist with this goal.
- Iowa Daughters will continue to demonstrate their love of lifelong learning to their family and community by participating in educational opportunities offered by the Iowa Society, their chapters, and their community.

THE IOWA ROOM: OUR CORNER IN WASHINGTON, D.C.

SPF 15? SPF 30? Or simply throw caution to the winds and resort to baby oil and iodine? That's what those of us of "a certain age" did in years gone by. Of course, we hadn't heard of SPF. Decisions, decisions. No matter what century, women always have taken the best precautions available to preserve their complexions, even if the only solution at hand was a sun bonnet. One of my grandmothers told me she used heavy cream (fresh from the cow?) to soften her skin and bleach freckles.

The fireplace screen was one method of protecting a woman's skin as she sat fireside. There are different types of fire screens in the history of furniture. One type was not meant for directing heat, but rather for covering, in a decorative way, the gaping mouth of an empty fireplace. (*Note: A floral arrangement blocks the lowa Room fireplace opening in the summer months, as is period appropriate. Fresh flowers may not be placed in Period Rooms.*)

The delicate needlework screen gracing the lowa Room is a second type--a pole screen. The screen itself could move up and down on the pole, depending on the height or sitting position of the person it was shielding. Primarily, these were used to keep the heat or glare of fire from the face of the ladies. The screen is approximately 25 inches high by 21 inches wide, and



worked in silk and woolen threads on linen ground. A name in the lower left corner is not legible, but the date reads 1747. It is English in origin. The mahogany base is tripod, carved and turned. The subject is a bouquet with bow and acanthus leaf.

The Iowa Room screen was a purchase by the Iowa Society DAR. In 1998 Iowa Daughters funded extensive conservation on the screen to replace disintegrated silk threads and stabilize it for the future.

Maja Sunleaf, a Junior member of Lawrence Van Hook Chapter, Maquoketa, recently returned from her first archaeology dig near the ancient El Quartelejo pueblo ruins in Scott County, Kansas. While on the dig, she unearthed several pottery sherds that support the theory that certain Indian tribes traveled further north than previously believed. According to Maja, "There are arguments that Puebloan people may have come to Kansas and taught them how to do pottery."

Maja, a 2013 Dubuque Senior High School graduate, is a sophomore at the University of lowa where she majors in Anthropology and Spanish.

On a side note, the El Quartelejo ruins were designated as a National Historic site by the Kansas DAR in 1925 and an obelisk was erected near the site.

Lori A. Fritz, a member of the Glenwood, Iowa Chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution was recently promoted to the rank of Colonel in a ceremony held in Sidney, Nebraska. Lori has served a total of 28 years in the Army Nurse Corps, 21 years of active service and 7 years in the reserves. Several members of the Glenwood DAR Chapter attended the ceremony to include her mother, Sharon Melvin. Also in attendance was her aunt, Patricia Curtis and Nancy Downing who both traveled from Iowa. The presiding officer for the promotion ceremony was COL Cynthia J. Abbadini, a member of the Chester County, Pennsylvania DAR.

COL Fritz started her military career as an ROTC Cadet while attending the University of Nebraska. Her grandmother Marjorie Swett was one of Lori's most ardent supporters and was the first DAR member in the family. Lori received an Associate Degree in Nursing from the University of Nebraska in 1985, and graduated with a Bachelor of Science degree in Nursing in 1987. Lori subsequently earned a Master of Science degree as an Acute Care Nurse Practitioner from the University of South Carolina in 1995 and a second Master of Science in 2001 through the U. S. Army Graduate Program for Anesthesia Nursing, to become a nurse anesthetist. In addition to her promotion this summer, Lori also graduated from Rocky Mountain University of Health Professions in August and was conferred a Doctorate of Nursing Practice.

COL Fritz is currently serving as the Deputy Commander for Nursing, Moncrief Army Community Hospital, Fort Jackson, SC. Her previous military assignments include medical-surgical staff nurse and intensive care staff nurse, William Beaumont Army Medical Center, El Paso, TX; intensive care staff nurse, 121st Evacuation Hospital, Yongsan, South Korea; staff Certified Registered Nurse Anesthetist and later Chief, Nursing Anethesia, Moncrief Army Community Hospital, Fort Jackson, SC; Senior Clinical Instructor and subsequently Program Director of the U. S. Army Graduate Program for Anesthesia Nursing Phase 2 clinical site, Tripler Army Medical Center, Honolulu, Hawaii; and Chief, Nursing Anesthesia, Blanchfield Army Community Hospital, Fort Campbell, KY. COL Fritz has deployed 3 times and served as staff Certified Registered Nurse Anesthetist, 86th Combat Support Hospital, Logistics Supply Area Adder, Iraq; a staff Certified Registered Nurse Anesthetist, 758th Forward Surgical Detachment, Forward Operating Base Asadabad, Afghanistan; and as the Senior Anesthetist, 21st Combat Support Hospital, Contingency Operating Base Speicher, Iraq.

COL Fritz's awards and decorations include the Meritorious Service Medal (4 OLCs), Army Commendation Medal (4 OLCs), Army Achievement Medal, National Defense Service Medal, Afghanistan Campaign Medal with Campaign Star, Iraq Campaign Medal with 3 Campaign Stars, Global War on Terrorism Service Medal, Korea Defense Service Medal, Meritorious Unit Commendation, and the Army Superior Unit Award (2nd Award). She has also been awarded the Order of Military Medical Merit and the prestigious Army Surgeon General's 9A proficiency designator for Nursing Anesthesia.

Constitution Week is celebrated September 17-23 each year. This is a tradition which was started many years ago by the Daughters of the American Revolution. In 1955 the DAR petitioned Congress to set aside September 17-23 annually to be dedicated for the observance of Constitution Week. The resolution was later adopted by the US Congress and signed into Public Law #915 on August 2, 1956 by President Dwight D. Eisenhower.

The Iowa Society DAR received a proclamation signed by Iowa Governor Terry Branstad on August 12, 2014 proclaiming September 17-23, 2014 as Constitution Week. All Iowa chapters can count this proclamation on their Master Questionnaire, in addition to any proclamations each chapter receives.

Chapter chairs are encouraged to ask their chapters to recite the Preamble to the Constitution during their patriotic exercises or read a Constitution Minute during their chapter meetings.

Last year lowa received several awards for Constitution Week, including "State with the Most Constitution Week Kits by Division" and "State with the Most Constitution Week Displays by Division!" Be sure to keep track of all your chapter's Constitution Week events, and forward them to me as soon as possible. You do not have to wait until you complete the Master Questionnaire (Chapter Master Report) to send me a report of your activities.
