

Each archive has specific collections that may be of use to you in your search for documents. A check of each website (https://iowagenealogy.org, and/or https://iowacul-


ture.gov/history/research) may help you to determine which archive would be best for what you are researching, or you

Preserving the history of Iowa DAR.... "So much of our future lies in preserving our past" *

Fall is here and with the beginning of the season, ISDAR starts to really get busy and that includes information for various NSDAR contests.

This Officer is responsible for the **NSDAR Outstanding Teacher of American History** contest.



Chapters.....now is the time to start thinking of and nominating a candidate. Full time teachers in the public, parochial and private schools from grades 5-12 are eligible for this award. The class subject taught should be American History or related fields such as social studies, government, civics or citizenship. Being a teacher is as challenging as ever and how better to honor an excellent teacher than to nominate them for this award. What teacher in your school system should be honored in this way?

Also, a complete list of Iowa State Regents from even before the organization of ISDAR, (DAR Chapters in Iowa voted to organize an Iowa Society DAR which they did in 1899), will be added to honor these outstanding women for the 125th Anniversary of ISDAR.

Finally, I must add a correction from the Summer newsletter. Abigail Adams Chapter was the first DAR Chapter organized in Iowa in 1893. Not the Clinton Chapter, which was organized in 1895. My apologies to Abigail Adams Chapter!














From the State Recording Secretary

Looking for new members? Sometimes chapters have a "lull" Moment in chapter activity in membership. It is at this time that many people are looking for untapped sources for new members. Perhaps one source is one that many may not have considered. That is the Member At Large database. Members at large are those wishing to become a DAR member, but unable to be active in a chapter because of lifestyle, distance, or personal preference, may wish to join as a member-at-large. The applicant for member-at-large fulfills the same DAR lineage and application requirements as applicants who are applying for membership in a chapter. Regular chapter members may go Member At Large for some of the same reasons. However, Members At Large (MAL) does NOT have any affiliation with the state or individual chapters. Which means they cannot be associate members of a chapter, hold any position in a chapter as a Committee Chair or a State Committee Chair. They lose the benefits of chapter and state membership. They may, however, attend Continental Congress and Page there.

After awhile some of those who are Members At Large desire a close relationship with a chapter and its members. Chapters should check periodically without pressure those members that live near their chapter to see if they are interested in joining their chapter. Perhaps suggest they visit. Perhaps things have changed in their lives so this would be possible. Don't neglect these people, but don't force the issue. The MAL database could be a goldmine for some chapters. At least it is worth checking it out!

The purpose of the DAR Scholarship Committee is to share information about scholarships offered by both the National Society and the Iowa Society with your chapter and with schools in the communities you serve. Scholarship chairs publicize the scholarships by emailing or writing letters to your local school counselors. You can find out who the counselors are by Googling the name of a school system, clicking on the link for the high school and then looking for the names and addresses of the high school counselor.

The ISDAR website contains a sample letter for school counselors and posters advertising both Iowa Society and National Society scholarships. Be sure to edit the posters to include the name of your scholarship chair, contact information, and chapter name.

NSDAR Scholarships

Each year the National Society Daughters of the American Revolution (NSDAR) awards multiple scholarships to students showing dedication to the pursuit of higher education in diverse areas of study. DAR's scholarships are awarded and judged without regard to gender, race, color, religion, national origin, or disability. Applicants must be citizens of the United States.

For detailed information, applicants should access the NSDAR website https://www.dar.org/national-society/schol-arships. All applications are submitted using the online portal https://dar.academicworks.com which opens November 1 and closes January 31 each year.

The DAR Scholarship Committee does not process DAR Good Citizens, American Indian, or DAR School scholarships.

ISDAR Scholarships

The lowa Society Daughters of the American Revolution awards two scholarships for graduating high school students who plan to attend a U.S. Department of Education accredited school of post-secondary education.

The two scholarships awarded by the Iowa Society are the ISDAR Scholarship and the Amelia Jenks Bloomer Scholarship. Each scholarship is \$1000. The criteria and the application process are the same for both scholarships. Your chapter may nominate only one student for each scholarship. You may nominate the same student for both scholarships if you wish.

The scholarship fund is intended to assist worthy young people to complete a higher education. The applicant must be an American citizen, an lowa resident and be of good character.

Completed applications for Iowa Society scholarships are due to the Scholarship Chair by February 1.







Iowa City VA Healthcare System Submitted by Joyce Mandel

SERVING OUR VETERAN HEROS - in and near lowa City



There are many ways DAR members can serve Veterans (our nation's heroes) by helping a local VA facility!

The Iowa City VA Health Care System offers a wide range of health, support, and facility services for Veterans in eastern Iowa, and nearby States. The main location of this System is

the Iowa City VA Medical Center (on Highway 6). Regional Iowa Clinics within this System are located in Iowa City Federal Building, Burlington, Cedar Rapids, Coralville, Davenport, Decorah, Dubuque, Ottumwa, and Waterloo. CLICK HERE for more information about these and other locations.

There are fifteen (15) DAR Chapters in Iowa that are located within an hour's drive of at least one of these locations. Please consider supporting one or more of these facilities as a DAR Chapter project!

Once each quarter, DAR Representatives (along with representatives from many other local civic organizations) meet with the VA Center for Development and Civic Engagement (CDCE) to learn about new and urgent volunteer opportunities.

At the most recent VA Volunteer Services (VAVS) quarterly meeting for the Iowa City System, the following opportunities were reviewed.

- There is an on-going need for more volunteers at the Iowa City VA Medical Center. Critical roles needed to be filled are information desk "Ambassadors" (shifts include evening and weekends), and "Patient Escorts" (particularly on Monday and Friday afternoons).
- 2. The following VA regional locations are urgently in need of driver volunteers to get patients to their appointments: Cedar Rapids, Quad Cities, Waterloo, Fort Madison, Dubuque (Fridays only) and Benton County.
- A new VA Clinic facility is planned to open soon in Decorah. A DAR Chapter could sponsor a grand opening by offering sheet cake and coffee/water service to welcome VA patients.
- 4. The Compassionate Contact Corps (CCC) is a new virtual program that matches a volunteer with a Veteran who is experiencing loneliness or is socially isolated. In this one-on-one role, the DAR volunteer would commit to making a weekly phone call to the Veteran to provide socialization and companionship.
- 5. Veteran's Day will be celebrated at the Iowa City Medical Center on Thursday, November 9th and throughout that week at the regional locations. Please consider sponsoring a scheduled Veteran's Day activity at a clinic near your DAR Chapter and welcoming patients with a grateful heart for their service to our Country!

- 6. Donation items currently needed at most VA locations include:
 - \$10 and \$20 Hy-Vee gift cards
 - 5G TracFones (do not activate) and TracFone service cards
 - Practical shoes (new) of all sizes for Men and Women
 - Activities for waiting rooms and longer-term care patients such as playing cards, adult coloring books, crosswords, paperback books, and washable markers. These items must be new.
 - New clothes, season appropriate for one particular person all packaged up in a drawstring bag. Think of one person, and fill a drawstring bag with tshirts, shorts, sweatpants, sweatshirts, underwear, and socks. All items must be new. There can be no logos – everything should be plain. Sizes needed are Medium through 3XL, Gender-neutral, preferred.
