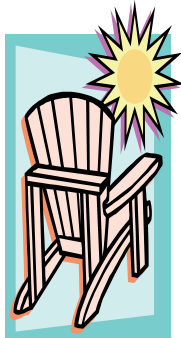

PROTOCOL POINTS

PROTOCOL POINTS - CONTINENTAL CONGRESS GUIDELINES

If you are planning to attend Continental Congress, the following information will assist you. These items are from the DAR HANDBOOK AND NATIONAL BYLAWS 2011.

Clothing – The weather in Washington in June/July can be hot and humid. You should dress comfortably for the climate and appropriately for the dignity of the occasion. Business-casual attire is recommended during the daytime sessions. More formal evening wear for the night sessions is fitting (i.e. long or tea-length dresses). Many members also bring a pair of white gloves for some of the teas and evening sessions. A word of caution – you may want to bring a light wrap as the buildings are air-conditioned. (I have found them to be very COLD!)

Guests - Husbands and families are welcome to register as guests with the Registration Committee. Events for men and families are scheduled. Washington affords many opportunities for sightseeing. Opening Night requires a ticket; however, open seating is available ten minutes before the scheduled start. Usually after opening night, more seating is available. Guests may attend most meetings.

Schedule- A schedule of events is printed in the March/April issue of the *Daughters* newsletter and is posted on the Members' Website after it is released in the newsletter. You are not expected to attend every luncheon and tea. Do plan to attend your own state function, all meetings of Congress and as many workshops as possible.

THE IOWA ROOM: OUR CORNER IN WASHINGTON, D.C.

In the last newsletter, we were treated to tea at a child-sized table, presided over by the doll now known as Arabella Lizette. Our thanks go out to Onalee Arnold and Suzanne Kisner for suggesting her name.

Continuing the theme, we feature the graceful circa 1820 mahogany tilt-top table donated by the Martha Washington Chapter, Sioux City. The top is 37 1-4 inches in diameter, with a plain round molded edge. The table stands 28 1-2 inches in height and is supported with a turned column on a tripod base of cabriole feet. The table was crafted in England in a style popular since the 1750s.

Martha Washington Chapter donated this important piece in 1952 in honor of Mrs. James Fitzgerald, Honorary State Regent of Iowa, our nineteenth State Regent, 1930 to 1932 and a member of that chapter. Once again, appreciation is expressed to the foresighted chapters and members who have so generously given to our Iowa Room.

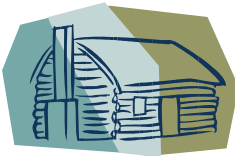

Jean Marie Cardinell Chapter was pleased to make two major donations in April 2013. The first was a memorial for a former JMC member. The family of Grace Foster, a 40 year member of our chapter, contributed a \$175.00 for a memorial in honor of Grace. After great deliberation and study, our chapter made a contribution to the Indian Youth of America Summer Camp Program. This is a non-profit organization dedicated to improving the quality of life of Indian Children. They provide opportunities and experience that will aid Indian youth in their educational, physical, cultural, personal, and career growth while fostering self-esteem and pride in their heritage. The main determining factor in our decision was the fact the camp is now headquartered in Sioux City, IA. Grace Foster was a teacher in the 1940's and our membership felt this would be a very fitting tribute to her devotion to the growth and education of children.

Jean Marie Cardinell's second contribution was to honor our Veterans buried at the Iowa Veterans Cemetery. With rapid deliberation, our chapter discussed and voted to sponsor the 40' flagpole and 10' x 15' American Flag at the American Legion Hall in Van Meter, Iowa. In December, after the Wreath Across America ceremony, several of our members viewed the temporary poles. One of our Community Service Honorees told our members of the opportunity to donate the new flagpole and flag. Jean Marie Cardinell is grateful for the chance to honor all veterans. The general public and families can attend the funeral but not the burials at the Iowa Veteran's Cemetery. Van Meter is a mile south of the cemetery and the American Legion Post 403 is in the process of finishing a beautiful new facility for families of veterans to use while they wait to view the grave of their veteran. 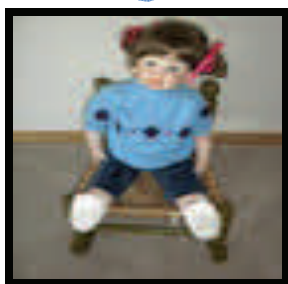
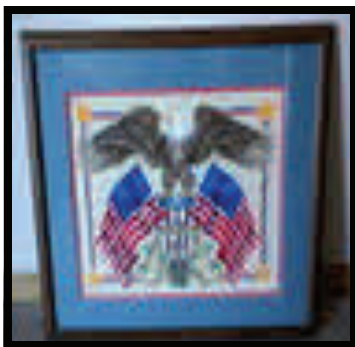

She had a table set with only one place setting and then explained the reason for each of the accessories on the table.

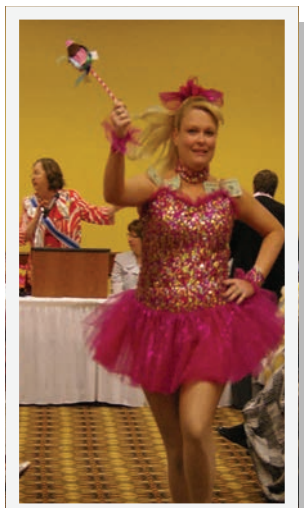


Ashley, Mayflower, & Marion-Linn Chapter's Good Citizen Winners
