#### HOT TIPS FOR LINKING GENERATIONS

Wills: They may not provide names, only relationships. Look at deeds and other earlier legal records.

**Draft Registration, Military and Pension files:**. They may have birth information and names of relatives.

**Birth records:** Be sure to ask for the complete record or the certificate with the parents' names.

Find the family in censuses:

More than one generation may be listed in a household with relationship.

**Death records:** May contain the parents' names.

NSDAR applications and supplementals: Look in the GRS Ancestor Database, check if the line is coded. Look in the GRS Descendants Database, check for common descendants in multiple generations.


choice for public buildings in the early  $20^{th}$  century. In fact, the courthouse is known as the largest public building in Prairie style in the world. Architectural students and aficionados from all over the world visit it regularly. Trimmed in elaborate terra cotta, the building features sculptures by Chicago artist Alphonso Iannelli on the outside and murals by painter John Warner Norton under a stained glass dome.

In November 2017, a time capsule was removed from the cornerstone and opened by county officials and Sioux City Museum staff. A display case was loaned by the museum to display the contents of the time capsule for the Centennial celebration.

#### 2018 VIETNAM VETERANS RECOGNITION DAY

It was a beautiful day for the 2018 Vietnam Veterans Recognition Day – the 10<sup>th</sup> one - on Monday, May 7<sup>th</sup> at 11:00 am. The program was held in front of the Iowa Vietnam Veterans Memorial located south of the Iowa State Capitol building. Dan Gannon, Chair of the Iowa Commission of Veterans Affairs was MC. The Keynote speaker was John Rowan, National President of the Vietnam Veterans of America. Other speakers included Governor Reynolds and Lt Governor Gregg. Other organizations were on hand to provide the presentation of colors, taps, 21-gun salute and the bag pipes. A very large crowd was on hand and afterwards everyone headed to the Veterans Auditorium for a free lunch provided by the Disable American Veterans. The Veterans then had time to talk and share.

Our Chapter pinned commemorative lapel pins on 92 Vietnam Veterans as well as handed out tin pins and commemorative Vietnam books.



- 3. Publicize chapter member's service activities (locally, state and or nationally).
